
Find the LIE, the CHEAT, and the STEAL, cards hidden in your search area to get started!

Challenge#1

Have fun doing this challenge activity together! Then you can turn back to your Bible and find another verse in Luke. This time it is Luke 19:8.


- First step is to fill the glass with nice, clean water. Imagine this glass of water is us. We know God's word tells us to be honest and not lie, cheat, or steal. We try to live honestly each day like God teaches staying nice and clean like the water.
- Now take a nickel and drop it into the glass of water. See it there on the bottom of the glass? Imagine that is a mistake we made in living honestly. Is that nickel hard to see or easy to see?
- When we make mistakes, which everyone does at some point, other people may see or hear about us being dishonest. We are likely to feel embarrassed or sorry that we lied, cheated or stole from someone.
- That's when we apologize and figure out a way to fix our mistake. We are going to
 do that with our glass by dropping pennies in to cover up the nickel.
 The pennies represent our apologies and our work to fix the problem we caused with
 our dishonesty.
- ·Take turns dropping pennies into the glass till the nickel is covered.
- Was it harder than you thought it was going to be to cover the nickel? That is very similar to how hard it is to cover up a lie or other dishonest act. God wants us to know this so we won't be tempted. And like His word says, when we can be trusted with little, we will be trusted with more.

Work your way through this maze puzzle to come out at the end honest like Zacchaeus - AKA Zack!






PUZZLE #4

This week, our focus was on honesty or the lack of honesty. We found that God does not approve of lies, stealing, or cheating. We can apply that knowledge to our lives each day, and we can also apply it to the way we get and handle our money.

It doesn't matter if it is a little money or millions and millions of dollars, it can all be earned and managed honestly. God wants good and great things for us, but He doesn't want us to get these things by hurting others.

We learned from the story of Zacchaeus that even if we do make bad choices, God doesn't give up on us. God keeps loving us and watching us, hoping to see us changing our ways - like Zacchaeus did.

When we realize that we have made bad choices and hurt others, we can also apologize and make up for the hurt we caused.

Most importantly, this week we read that what God really wants is for us to love each other. Yes, we need money to survive, but there is no reason for us to hurt others so we can get more money. We can earn it and care for it honestly, showing that we are trustworthy to earn and care for more.
