

Do 25 jumping jacks.










Final Clue

Solve these 10% problems to get the combination to the treasure chest!








Each person must complete your treasure chest card and attach it below.


Share your lists with each other.



CONGRATULATIONS!

Our adventure today was all about spending. We spend much more money than we save or give, so making wise choices with our spending is especially important.

Every day we see or hear ads urging us to buy something. Sometimes friends say, "You gotta get one of these!" So how do we know the right way to spend our money? How do we recognize the wrong way to spend it?

The Bible teaches us that the first step is to remember that it is God's money; we are simply taking care of it the best we can.

We also read that God wants us to enjoy our money and to buy things that satisfy us and that we delight in. We can do that by thinking about our spending - not just buying something because we can. We want to buy good things, things we need and hope to use for a long time.

The next thing we learned that will help us spend wisely is to be content with what we have. That doesn't mean you never get new things: it just means you don't get more than you need, and that you are happy with that.

And lastly, we found out that we need to talk to God about our spending.

- · Talk with Him about the things you would like to buy.
 - · Tell Him about spending mistakes you made.
- · Ask Him to help you when you can't decide what to do.

It won't all be wonderful at first. Learning to talk and listen to God takes effort. So does being content with what you have. But it is so worth the effort to learn these things now, because they will be a huge benefit to you as you grow!
